On Friday May 31, 2013, KHAIRULLOZHON MATANOV, date of birth (DOB) 10/04/1990, was interviewed at United States Attorney's Office, 408 Atlantic Avenue, Boston, Massachusetts. Present were MATANOV, his attorneys Paul Glickman and Stephanie Marzouk, Assistant United States Attorney Al Chakravarty, Task Force Officer Thomas J. Daly, Jr., Massachusetts State Trooper Joel Gagne, and writer. After being provided and signing a second proffer letter, MATANOV provided the following information:

In 2011, when MATANOV moved to the Boston area from the Cape, he attended services at the mosque on Prospect Street in Cambridge. It was in that mosque that he first met IBRAGIM TODASHEV and later met TAMERLAN TSARNAEV (TAMERLAN). After MATANOV met TAMERLAN, he asked TODASHEV if he knew TAMERLAN. TODASHEV stated that he did and proceeded to tell MATANOV about an argument he had with TAMERLAN that resulted in them not speaking. At that time, TODASHEV worked as a driver transporting elderly people in a minivan. TODASHEV taught MATANOV how to drive on the minivan.

In 2011, TODASHEV and an unknown individual picked up MATANOV in TODASHEV's car and traveled together to the mosque for the Eid celebration. TAMERLAN and DZHOKHAR TSARNAEV (DZHOKHAR) went together in a separate car. At that time, MATANOV did not have mutual friends with TODASHEV. Despite the photograph that shows them together and smiling that day, TAMERLAN and TODASHEV had not mended their relationship. They agreed to take the picture together because MATANOV asked them.

After Eid, TODASHEV told MATANOV that his lease was ending at his apartment in Brighton. He asked MATANOV if he could move his belongings into MATANOV's apartment and stay with him for a few nights while he cleaned his apartment. MATANOV could not immediately recall if his address at the time was the downstairs apartment at 40 or 49 Hobart St. in Brighton but later confirmed the address as 49 Hobart St. MATANOV had lived with his friend HUSSAN at that address but HUSSAN moved out prior to TODASHEV staying with MATANOV. HUSSAN currently lives in Roxbury, Massachusetts. MATANOV does not know if TODASHEV was working when he moved in. TODASHEV wanted to leave Massachusetts because he did not like the area. His wife lived in the South and he had previously enjoyed living

there so he wanted to return. MATANOV lived in the Hobart St. apartment until October 2011 when he moved to an address on Presidential Drive in Quincy. When TODASHEV and MATANOV spoke to each other, they spoke in Russian.

MATANOV initially stated that TODASHEV left Massachusetts in the beginning of September, 2011, approximately 9/4/11 or 9/5/11. TODASHEV moved into MATANOV's residence on 08/29/2013 and stayed with MATANOV for approximately 4 or 5 days before leaving for Florida to be with his wife. MATANOV did not know where exactly in Florida TODASHEV relocated. During TODASHEV's time in MATANOV's apartment, TODASHEV did not stay every night. On a few nights he went out to clubs and on those occasions he stayed with other friends. TODASHEV left MATANOV's residence while MATANOV was at work. At that time, MATANOV worked at McGarr Services Corporation on Arsenal St., Watertown. When he arrived home a few hours later, he saw that TODASHEV had left his boxing gloves. MATANOV called TODASHEV who said he was on either a bus or a train and because he was already a few hours away, he told MATANOV to keep the gloves.

MATANOV later admitted to not being positive of the date of TODASHEV's arrival at his apartment. While he believed it was 08/29/2013, it could have been the 27th or 28th. He is positive of the late August time frame because TODASHEV's lease was up at the end of the month and he needed time to clean. It was not possible that TODASHEV stayed at his residence for more than four or five days. TODASHEV neither could have resided with him nor left his belongings with MATANOV and stayed somewhere else for two(2) weeks. MATANOV also admitted to being home when TODASHEV left the apartment. He helped TODASHEV load his three bags into the car of someone named ABI, who was approximately 25 years of age and spoke Russian with a Chechen accent. MATANOV did not know ABI's full first or last name but recognized it as a nickname and was not aware of where ABI lived in Massachusetts. ABI drove TODASHEV to either the train station or the bus station. A few hours after TODASHEV left, when MATANOV was cleaning up, he saw the boxing gloves that TODASHEV left behind. MATANOV called TODASHEV to ask about the gloves but did not speak to him again. MATANOV assumed that TODASHEV was on a bus or train because he was leaving for Florida.

MATANOV and TODASHEV never went out for dinner. They never did anything social together outside of going to the mosque in 2011, and playing soccer, which occurred when TODASHEV briefly returned in 2012. TODASHEV was very quiet, had set boundaries and did not talk to a lot of people about personal things.

After TODASHEV moved out, MATANOV did not see or speak to him again until TODASHEV called MATANOV when he was in Massachusetts in 2012.

TODASHEV never gave MATANOV anything aside from the gloves and he never sent MATANOV a letter containing anything. MATANOV attempted to contact TODASHEV several times including phone calls to the number MATANOV had for TODASHEV and by leaving him a message on the Russian social media site odnaklassniki.

In May 2012, TODASHEV returned to the Boston area by driving his wife's Mazda. While he was in Massachusetts, he drove MATANOV to the weekly soccer game and introduced him to all of his friends who were playing. TODASHEV left Massachusetts the next day.

MATANOV did not give TODASHEV any money either during TODASHEV's stay or during the summer prior to TODASHEV's departure. In 2012, TODASHEV asked MATANOV for \$500 to help pay his rent. MATANOV was unable to give \$500, but he gave TODASHEV \$250. During this 2012 trip to Massachusetts, TODASHEV asked MATANOV for gas money to return to Florida and MATANOV gave him \$200. When TODASHEV asked MATANOV for money, he had driven over to MATANOV's apartment alone.

Almost all of the contact that MATANOV had with TODASHEV was at the mosque; they did not speak very often on the telephone. MATANOV was shown telephone records from Summer, 2011 that contained numerous phone calls between July, 2011 until 9/10/2011 and EBT records that suggest that TODASHEV's card was used by TODASHEV until 9/10/2011 and was used by MATANOV on 9/14/2013. After viewing the records, MATANOV maintained that TODASHEV did not spend more than four(4) or five(5) days in MATANOV's house. At most, TODASHEV had stayed with MATANOV for six(6) days and left Massachusetts when he left MATANOV's residence. It was not possible that TODASHEV stayed until 9/10/2011.

MATANOV then revised his statement (WRITER'S NOTE: By this time, MATANOV had been provided with toll records and EBT records to demonstrate the date of TODASHEV's departure could not have been 9/4/2011). On 08/29/2011, TODASHEV moved his things into MATANOV's residence. After a few nights, he left his things with MATANOV and stayed somewhere else in the Boston area for several nights at a location unknown to MATANOV. On 09/10/2011, TODASHEV returned to MATANOV's residence to retrieve his belongings. MATANOV usually finished work around 10:00pm. At approximately 11:00pm, TODASHEV left.

MATANOV later revised his statement again. On 08/29/2011 TODASHEV told MATANOV that he was leaving and asked to stay with MATANOV. TODASHEV stayed approximately three(3) or four(4) nights before leaving his belongings with MATANOV and staying with someone else. MATANOV never asked TODASHEV where he stayed when he did not stay with MATANOV. TODASHEV brought his laptop computer, which he allowed MATANOV to use and which he

left in the apartment when he left his belongings for a few days. On 9/11/2011, MATANOV returned home from work to find his door unlocked and the apartment empty. It is possible that the date was either 9/9/2011, 9/10/2011 or 9/11/2011. On Sundays, MATANOV typically worked until approximately 10:00pm but could have left earlier if it was slow. Because the door was unlocked, MATANOV assumed that TODASHEV had returned but did not see him. He attempted to call TODASHEV's cell phone but it rang in the apartment. MATANOV went to the garage where he could receive his neighbor's wireless Internet signal. MATANOV had headphones on when he was in the garage and he most likely watched videos on the Internet for approximately one(1) hour. TODASHEV was in the shower when MATANOV went back into the house. After he got out of the shower, TODASHEV asked MATANOV to help move his bags out to the car, including his laptop computer. TODASHEV left some things behind, including a bunch of clothes, a box of socks, a medal from fighting, boxing gloves and a drinking cup. TODASHEV gave MATANOV his EBT card and returned MATANOV's spare key while outside by the car. MATANOV is not aware if TODASHEV made any phone calls or ate while he was in MATANOV's home that evening (WRITER'S NOTE: MATANOV drew a layout of the apartment indicating the location the car was parked).

MATANOV is not certain what time he arrived home that evening and did not notice anything unusual about the bathroom after TODASHEV showered. MATANOV threw away TODASHEV's towel, as well as almost everything else he left behind in that week's garbage pick-up. The only thing of TODASHEV's that MATANOV kept were the boxing gloves. He did not keep the towel because he did not want another person's used towel even if it was washed. MATANOV was not surprised by TODASHEV's departure because TODASHEV had told MATANOV that he was leaving imminently in the days leading up to 9/11/2011. MATANOV does not remember what TODASHEV was wearing when he left that night.

The driver of the waiting car got out of the vehicle to shake MATANOV's hand. His name might have been ABI or ABDI, he spoke Russian and was from either Dagestan or Chechnya. It was dark outside and he could not tell the color of ABI's hair, although he could see that it was not very long, approximately the length of TODASHEV's hair. ABI had an athletic build and may have been approximately the same height as MATANOV. He drove a nice-looking sedan, possibly a BMW and he never turned off the engine even when he got out of the car. MATANOV could not determine the color of the vehicle. MATANOV and TODASHEV placed TODASHEV's bags in an empty trunk. MATANOV does not recall the type of plate but knew that it was not a rental. TODASHEV got into the front passenger seat. MATANOV could not see into the backseat of the car, which was parked in front of his neighbor's house. MATANOV's neighbor at the time was Chinese.

Initially, MATANOV was untruthful in his answers surrounding TODASHEV's departure because he was worried about the true date, 9/11/2011. MATANOV did not want to either cause the death of someone or a problem for himself or someone else.

To MATANOV's knowledge, TAMERLAN and TODASHEV never mended their disagreement and when TODASHEV left Massachusetts they were still arguing. When MATANOV would discuss TODASHEV with TAMERLAN, TAMERLAN would say that TODASHEV's move was a good thing for him.

After TODASHEV left, MATANOV attempted to call him many times but TODASHEV never answered the phone. MATANOV did not follow the news in 2011 and therefore did not learn of the murders in Waltham until 2013 after they were reported in relation to the marathon bombings. Neither TODASHEV, TAMERLAN nor DZHOKHAR ever mentioned the murders and MATANOV had never seen the names of the people killed. When he learned of the bombings, he did not think that TODASHEV was involved.

TAMERLAN told MATANOV that he used to smoke a lot of marijuana. MATANOV asked TODASHEV if he used to smoke marijuana because he knew that TODASHEV and TAMERLAN used to go to clubs together. TODASHEV denied smoking marijuana. MATANOV did not know the names of other people that went to the clubs with TODASHEV and TAMERLAN. It is possible they went to the club with a man unknown to MATANOV named ABDULLAH or "ABI", the same ABI who picked up TODASHEV from MATANOV's residence the night TODASHEV moved out and drove him to either South or North Station to catch either a bus or train.

Both MATANOV and TODASHEV had food assistance cards (EBT cards) in 2011. left Massachusetts (WRITER'S NOTE: At this time, MATANOV provided the date TODASHEV left Massachusetts as 9/11/2011). When TODASHEV returned to Massachusetts in 2012, he asked MATANOV about the card and MATANOV told him he no longer used it. When he stopped using the card he cut it up and threw it away.

MATANOV did not recall exactly when he spoke to TODASHEV prior to the call MATANOV made to TODASHEV the day after his first interview with the FBI after the marathon bombings. After being informed that they spoke on 4/14/2013 for approximately 22 minutes, MATANOV provided that during that conversation they discussed TODASHEV's health, specifically a foot injury he had obtained either in an accident or in a fight that caused him to be on crutches. Despite the injury and the fact he had been on crutches, TODASHEV was still fighting. TODASHEV told MATANOV that he had received his green card and purchased a ticket to go to Russia that summer for approximately three months. TODASHEV stated he was definitely returning to the United States. They did not speak about either TAMERLAN or DZHOKHAR.

During the phone call on the day after MATANOV was interviewed first by the FBI, MATANOV asked TODASHEV why the FBI was asking questions about him. TODASHEV told MATANOV that he had already been questioned by the FBI and that he had cancelled his trip to Russia. TODASHEV was afraid that if he went to Russia, the FBI would think he was guilty of something. Neither MATANOV nor TODASHEV instructed each other to take any action. It was their first conversation after the marathon bombing and the first time they spoke after TAMERLAN was identified as one of the bombers and killed. MATANOV may have said he was surprised or that he did not believe it was TAMERLAN. He does not recall what TODASHEV said about TAMERLAN's participation in the bombing.

Later, MATANOV was asked again about his and TODASHEV's first conversation after the bombing and after TAMERLAN was identified as one of the bombers. TODASHEV did not say anything in response to MATANOV's surprise that TAMERLAN was involved in the bombing. TODASHEV told MATANOV that he cancelled his trip to Russia because of his concern that it would cause a red flag for law enforcement. It was a relatively short conversation; they were worried that if they spoke for a while it would draw additional attention. He does not remember if they talked about the Waltham murders during that conversation. MATANOV decided on his own to alter the timeline for TODASHEV's stay with him in September 2011. TODASHEV never told MATANOV to minimize his knowledge of TODASHEV's activities or to hide the identity of ABI. MATANOV is unaware if anyone else may have helped them.

MATANOV does not know who was in TODASHEV's friendship circle.

TODASHEV never met TODASHEV's Armenian wife and does not know her name. MATANOV is not aware if TODASHEV had a girlfriend in Massachusetts as they did not speak about girls. MATANOV has never been in a car with both TODASHEV and TAMERLAN at the same time. MATANOV is not aware if TODASHEV read jihadi literature. MATANOV never talked to VISKHAH about TODASHEV. Once TAMERLAN asked MATANOV for VISKHAH's telephone number. There were occasions that TAMERLAN, MATANOV and VISKHAH played soccer together. Once MATANOV went to ALIKHAN's home to eat with TAMERLAN and VISKHAH after soccer. On a separate day, MATANOV went to ALIKHAN's house with TAMERLAN, HUSSAN and the student ADAM who recently returned to Russia. MATANOV has never been out to eat with either Adam(WRITER'S NOTE: picture 7) or VISKHAH. When TODASHEV moved into MATANOV's residence, VISKHAH may have dropped him off.

When TAMERLAN returned to the United States in 2012 after his trip to Russia, MATANOV went to Eid celebration with him. MATANOV is not sure exactly when TAMERLAN returned from Russia but if he came back to Massachusetts before the first Eid, they would have gone to both Eids together at the mosque. If he returned after the first Eid, they only went to the second Eid together. TAMERLAN told MATANOV that while he was overseas he attended mosque in Chechnya and learned the Koran. TAMERLAN also discussed the problems men with beards received from the police. TAMERLAN was the same when he came back from Russia as when he left, with the exception of his long beard.

During their first meeting, TAMERLAN talked about jihad in Chechnya for approximately 4-5 minutes while MATANOV listened. When TAMERLAN mentioned the FBI's interest in him, MATANOV told him not to talk about that kind of subject anymore. MATANOV neither watched jihaidist videos with TAMERLAN nor did TAMERLAN watch jihadist videos with anyone else in his presence and he would be surprised if someone said TAMERLAN watched jihadi videos in MATANOV's presence.

While at the mosque's Eid celebration in 2012, MATANOV met MOHAMED(last name unknown to MATANOV). It was the only time that MATANOV saw MOHAMED, although MATANOV may have called MOHAMED and asked him to play soccer. During the Eid celebration, MOHAMED and TAMERLAN discussed a recent bombing in Chechnya that resulted in the death of civilians as well as some government officials. TAMERLAN remarked that he hoped one of the dead government officials was RAMZAN KADYROV, Chechnya's president. MOHAMED argued on behalf of Chechnya's president. MATANOV told them to stop arguing, that Eid was a time for celebration. Afterwards, TAMERLAN, TAHA(last name unknown to MATANOV, telephone number 857-249-3307), and MOHAMED went to Quincy beach in two(2) cars, MOHAMED and TAMERLAN in TAMERLAN's car and TAHA and MATANOV in MATANOV's taxi. TAMERLAN invited

MATANOV over to his house for lunch to have lunch with his mother. The group went back to the mosque to drop off MATANOV's car and TAHA. MATANOV, MOHAMED and TAMERLAN traveled via TAMERLAN's car to drive MOHAMED home before TAMERLAN and MATANOV continued to TAMERLAN's house. At first, MATANOV insisted that it was not possible that MOHAMED went to TAMERLAN's house that day and that MATANOV had never been to TAMERLAN's house with MOHAMED. He later stated that it was unlikely but a possibility that they went to TAMERLAN's house first and took MOHAMED home afterwards. TAMERLAN's mother served chicken and salad. MATANOV did not see either KATHERINE or ZAHIRA at the house.

MATANOV does not recall TAMERLAN talking to MOHAMED or watching a video of insurgent attacks in Afghanistan on that Eid. MATANOV did not hear TAMERLAN tell MOHAMED that he wanted to go back to Dagestan to join the mujahideen. Over the course of their relationship, TAMERLAN never told MATANOV about trying to join the mujahideen in Dagestan. TAMERLAN did not express a desire to join fighting anywhere in the world, never justified the use of force and made no remarks when USAMA BIN LADEN was killed. TAMERLAN talked about Syria as he was upset that so many people died and no one seemed to care, although MATANOV never heard TAMERLAN discuss going to Syria to fight. MATANOV does not support traveling to Syria to engage in fighting. MATANOV never heard TAMERLAN mention either Inspire magazine or translations of texts from scholars like ABDULLAH AZZAM or MAQDISI. MATANOV does not know the names ABDULLAH AZZAM or MAQDISI. TAMERLAN talked about the mujahideen on the first day that MATANOV met him but MATANOV did not want to discuss it. MATANOV never heard TAMERLAN talking about the mujahideen with anyone else. MATANOV does not know the name TAREK MEHANNA and TAMERLAN never mentioned MEHANNA's trial. TAMERLAN never told MATANOV that he knew how to make a bomb or set an explosion.

Towards the end of the interview, after a brief break in which he spoke with his attorney, MATANOV provided that it may have been possible that TAMERLAN watched a jihadist video while he was in the room. The television was always on at 410 Norfolk St. and TAMERLAN occasionally used his Samsung laptop while MATANOV was there. MATANOV never saw what TAMERLAN was watching on his laptop.

The hiking trip to Mt. Monadnock between MATANOV and TAMERLAN occurred after Ramadan in 2012. MATANOV believes that Islam teaches people to be brothers and simply because they hiked together and TAMERLAN talked about the mujahideen did not equate to them wanting to attack the White House. MATANOV did not want to have a problem so he did not discuss extremist things with TAMERLAN. He and TAMERLAN did not have secrets. The hike occurred on a hot day and MATANOV dressed up like the singer of a famous nasheed.

After they went hiking, MATANOV would call TAMERLAN once in a while and ask to see him. In approximately December 2012, MATANOV shaved his beard and cut off all of his hair because his brother Habiballah did and said it grows back well. MATANOV did not think it was odd to cut off all of his hair in winter because he usually wears a hat anyway.

On 04/15/2013, when MATANOV went to Cambridge to pick up TAMERLAN for dinner, he did not go into TAMERLAN's residence. He first honked his horn from the street and when TAMERLAN did not come down he walked under the trellis and shouted TAMERLAN's name to the open window in TAMERLAN's residence. After dinner that evening, MATANOV is not sure if he dropped them off at the intersection of Norfolk and Webster or if he dropped them off in front of TAMERLAN's home. MATANOV gave TAMERLAN a pack of Orbit gum as TAMERLAN got out of the car. It is not possible that he went into their home; after the bombings he did not go into the residence until Wednesday.

MATANOV definitively knew that the bombers were his friends when he heard their names on the radio. He first suspected it when the police at the T station told him the perpetrators were Chechen brothers. He did not recognize the pictures because TAMERLAN was wearing a hat and DZHOKHAR had curly hair and did not suspect their participation.

After being asked again if he entered TAMERLAN's residence on 04/15/2013, MATANOV stated that he did not go upstairs into TAMERLAN's house. It would not be possible for someone to have a video of him entering the residence.

At the end of the interview, MATANOV revised his statements regarding the events of 04/15/2013. MATANOV called TAMERLAN shortly after the bombings and they made plans to go to dinner that night. When he went to pick up TAMERLAN for dinner, he went into the home. MATANOV brought a box of juice for ZAHIRA and some dates as TAMERLAN and DZHOKHAR fasted that day per the Muslim tradition of fasting on Mondays and Thursdays. MATANOV sat on the couch and waited for approximately 15 minutes for TAMERLAN to change his clothes. When he arrived at the house, TAMERLAN was wearing a white t-shirt, big shoes like one would wear to box, and athletic pants. TAMERLAN and DZHOKHAR were watching the news coverage of the bombings on the television and also had CNN news streaming on the computer. No one else was home; MATANOV did not see either KATHERINE or ZAHIRA. TAMERLAN expressed glee over the bombings and called them the biggest thing since 9/11. Specifically, TAMERLAN laughed at the images of an old man running from the blast. DZHOKHAR did not laugh along with TAMERLAN; he mostly stayed silent and played with the cat. When they were at the Man O Salwa restaurant, MATANOV asked DZHOKHAR what was wrong and DZHOKHAR said he had a cold or the flu. That evening, MATANOV asked DZHOKHAR about unlocking

MATANOV's iPhones and DZHOKHAR said that he could do it. While he was in TAMERLAN's residence, MATANOV did not see any weapon. On a previous occasion he had seen TAMERLAN with a BB gun. MATANOV could not recall what DZHOKHAR was wearing that night. MATANOV did not leave TAMERLAN's home with anything nor did TAMERLAN ask MATANOV to do anything.

MATANOV originally lied to the FBI because he was scared. He did not think that TAMERLAN's reaction to the bombings was unusual as TAMERLAN had been exposed to a lot of violence and been in lots of fights. He did not ask TAMERLAN why he was happy or why he was laughing.

On Wednesday, 4/17/2013, TAMERLAN told MATANOV that DZHOKHAR may come home that evening. They discussed the bombings almost the entire time MATANOV was in the residence. MATANOV did not know that TAMERLAN participated in the bombings. TAMERLAN did not tell MATANOV why he wanted to give away his computer.

MATANOV purchased the iPhone 5 found in his residence for approximately \$200 from an African American male at the Braintree T stop taxi stand. MATANOV has not seen that individual since the day of his purchase. He obtained the iPhone 4 found in his residence from a cab fare by giving someone a ride to Forrest Hills in exchange for their phone. MATANOV wanted the phones to send to his brothers in Kyrgystan.

When MATANOV went to TAMERLAN's home over the years, KATHERINE would occasionally be there. He and TAMERLAN would hang out either in the kitchen or the living room. They never spoke about politics in front of KATHERINE but they would discuss aspects of the Islamic religion such as the correct way to pray. TAMERLAN and MATANOV would only talk about family and tell each other funny things.

MATANOV never saw TAMERLAN get angry and never felt that TAMERLAN was going to hurt him. He never saw TAMERLAN angry at his wife and only saw them talk about basic domestic topics. After TAMERLAN had an outburst at the Khutbah, MATANOV calmed him down and told him not act out in the mosque.

MATANOV was shown a number of pictures and he made the following identifications:

11. Resembles TODASHEV's friend Anton, whose last name is unknown to MATANOV. In 2012, ANTON traveled with TODASHEV from Florida to Massachusetts and accompanied TODASHEV to soccer. His phone number is 617-304-4570. While in Massachusetts, ANTON, a former Catholic and a Russian, went to the large Roxbury mosque and made Shahada, ie. converted to Islam. MATANOV saw TODASHEV and ANTON twice during that trip, at the soccer game and the day they went to the mosque. TAMERLAN was in Russia at that time and MATANOV told Anton about TAMERLAN's trip. MATANOV does not know if ANTON knew about TAMERLAN's trip prior to him telling him. MATANOV also told TODASHEV that TAMERLAN went to Chechnya. TODASHEV did not address the comment and did not ask any questions. While in Massachusetts in 2012, TODASHEV did not stay with MATANOV because MATANOV was living with multiple people.

12. IBRAGIM TODASHEV. MATANOV just recently learned TODASHEV's last name; he previously only knew him as IBRAGIM. MATANOV does not know if TODASHEV ever changed his phone number but provided it as 407-350-0932.

MATANOV most recently saw MOHAMED at soccer a few weeks ago. MOHAMED's phone number is 617-669-9095. MATANOV is not aware if MOHAMED was friends with TAMERLAN.

21. KATHERINE TSARNAEV. MATANOV never spoke to KATHERINE on the phone and does not have her number in his telephone contact list.

MATANOV knows a Russian named PASHA who used to play soccer and worked as a mover. PASHA was quiet, tall, approximately 24 or 25 years of age and worked as a mover. His phone number is 407-729-7554. MATANOV is not aware if PASHA knew TAMERLAN.

When MATANOV meets someone, he often puts their number into his phone in case he ever needs to speak to them again. If he does not know their name, he will sometimes enter "Brat." "Brat" means "brother" in Russian and indicates to MATANOV that the individual is either Chechen or Russian. If MATANOV enters "brother" in his phone, it indicates to him that the person is of any other nationality. The word "uka" means older and "ika" means younger.

MATANOV does not recognize the name "Papa" aside from it referring to a father. MATANOV calls his own father "dada," which means father.

After the break, MATANOV was again shown picture 14. MATANOV identified him as VISKHAN but did not know his last name (spelled VISXAN in MATANOV's contact list) and provided his phone number as 617-412-1904. TODASHEV introduced MATANOV to VISKHAN in 2012. MATANOV may have seen him in the mosque but they never socialized outside of soccer. Every time MATANOV

called VISKHAN for soccer, VISKHAN was busy and he never attended. Approximately four(4) months ago, VISKHAN did show up for soccer. MATANOV believes it was four(4) months ago because they were wearing heavy clothes. VISKHAN was wearing a hoodie. MATANOV is not aware if VISKHAN and TODASHEV was friendly with TODASHEV outside of soccer.

After the break, MATANOV was again shown picture 7 and told that the individual's name was ADAM. MATANOV did not recognize the picture, although he knows another ADAM who was younger and had returned to Russia. His phone number was 857-928-4492 and his email address was a.malsagow@gmail.com.

In Kyrgystan, MATANOV was a student activist, which meant that he would notify other students of events. The term "student activist" did not have any political connotation and it only pertained to the rights of students at the University. MATANOV was once kicked out of an event at City Hall because he was Uzbek.

At the initiation of the proffer, MATANOV was provided with a second proffer letter that included the 2011 Waltham murders. Per MATANOV's attorney's request, this letter was initialed by Trooper Joel Gagne, who participated in the proffer session. AUSA Alope Chakravarty reminded MATANOV that his first proffer letter regarding the marathon bombings still applied to this proffer session. MATANOV requested to go to Friday services at Roxbury mosque. To accommodate this schedule, the proffer was paused at approximately 12:35pm and re-commenced at approximately 2:55pm. Throughout the interview, MATANOV was offered and accepted water. In addition to the break for him to attend the services at the mosque, he left the room to speak privately with his attorney on at least two(2) occasions. He also left the room to utilize the bathroom without the accompaniment of law enforcement. At the end of the proffer, MATANOV expressed concern for his family in Krygystan, whose friends were being questioned by the FSB about him and asked if the FBI could work with the FSB to protect his family. MATANOV was told that the FBI had no authority in Krygystan and could not control the actions of another country's law enforcement services.
